\$1,000 REWARD

The Government of the Province of Ontario, and the Township of King, will pay a combined reward of **ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00)** for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the murder of GERALDINE PICKFORD, age 40.

GERALDINE PICKFORD, who had been employed as a dining room waitress at St. Andrew's College, Aurora, Ontario, was struck about the face and then strangled sometime between 9.30 P.M. and 11.00 P.M., September 18, 1965, on the grounds of the college adjacent to No. 11 Highway. There was no sexual attack nor any evidence of robbery.

In the event of more than one person claiming the reward, or to be entitled to a share therein, it will be apportioned as the Attorney General for Ontario deems just.

Any person in possession of information regarding the identity of the person or persons responsible for the murder of GERALDINE PICKFORD should communicate immediately with the nearest police authority, the Chief Constable, Township of King, or the Commissioner of the Ontario Provincial Police.
